Comments From the questionnaires for Area of Strategic Visual Importance (ASVIO)	Questionnaire Number
<p>In the context of the areas noted to be included in the ASVI, question 1 and 2 are ambiguously worded to say the least. Yes I support the ASVI on Snoxhall Fields. But not including the Cranleigh Village Hospital Trust (CVHT) site to the north. Yes I support the extension of the ASVI to the areas within the dark blue lines.</p> <p>It seems senseless to include the CVHT site within the ASVI designation given that the proposed facilities will be of huge benefit to the Cranleigh community, and have been fought for by so many people for so long. I am surprised that the Neighbourhood Planning Committee are considering the site for ASVI designation considering the incredibly difficult years of planning that have gone into returning NHS/social services step-down (convalescence) services to Cranleigh after the closure of beds in 2006. Furthermore, the proposals are on the verge of being submitted for planning approval.</p> <p>The site is, and will continue to be, visually contained by existing mature trees so have negligible visual impact when viewed from each side. Littlemead Brook seems a more sensible boundary for the ASVI. Furthermore, the CVHT proposals will be contiguous with existing settlement to the north and west, and existing civic and health facility to the east, hence making the most sensible use of the land.</p>	4

[Do you support the ASVI on Snoxhall Fields] What does this mean? Criteria is flawed.	6
How can the ASVI include the site where it is proposed to build new community beds to replace those lost many years ago.	7
The concept of the ASVI is very important but its value is compromised by the inclusion of the CVHT site. How is this possible? Where is the logic.	8
If the ASVI did not include this site on which the community beds are to be built, then I would say 'yes' to both questions.	9
I would support the ASVI on Snoxhall Fields if it did not include the CVHT site which the Council swapped so as to enable our community beds to be replaced. Am I missing something here?	10
Confusing - isn't the top triangle section of Snoxhall Fields the area where the new hospital is hoped to be built? If so then am not sure why it is necessary to include it in this matter.	12
I am very concerned that the essential character of the village is maintained but do not think that this particular initiative is important. I do however, think that the new hospital project is vital - I applaud the tireless work that has gone into this initiative, which is nearing completion, so it is now totally inappropriate to consider alteration to the use of this site.	13

I have difficulty understanding why you have not specified the important CVHT site - I and my family thoroughly approve of their plans.	18
ASVI is important to Cranleigh but there are two inconsistencies in your draft plan. Your proposed ASVI for Snoxhall Fields does not take account of plans to create new community hospital beds and key worker accommodation for health workers. Because this site is mostly enclosed by trees, it adds nothing to ASVI designation and should be removed. We need these beds and key workers accommodation in Cranleigh - please don't create unnecessary roadblocks to this scheme! Secondly, your proposed settlement boundary runs along the north of the CVHT site, putting it outside of the boundary. Are you aware of the CVHT plans and should change this settlement boundary accordingly. I look forward to seeing now your draft plan proposes and hope you will take on board these points.	19
