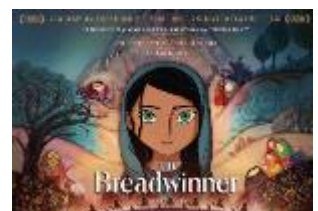


Film: The Breadwinner (12A)

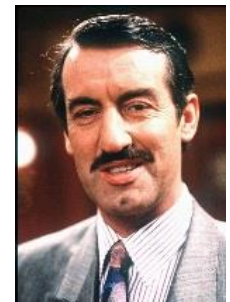


Comedy: **Only Fools & Boycie**
