

Q6 To what extent, if at all, do you think more housing is needed for people aged 16 to 64?



Q7 How important or unimportant is it for new housing to be able to accommodate the needs of people with disabilities?







Q10 How important or unimportant is it to have part own/part rent homes in Cranleigh?





Q12 To what extent, if at all, do you agree that new building should only happen on previously developed land?



Q13 To what extent, if at all, do you agree that new building should only happen on previously undeveloped land?


















































