

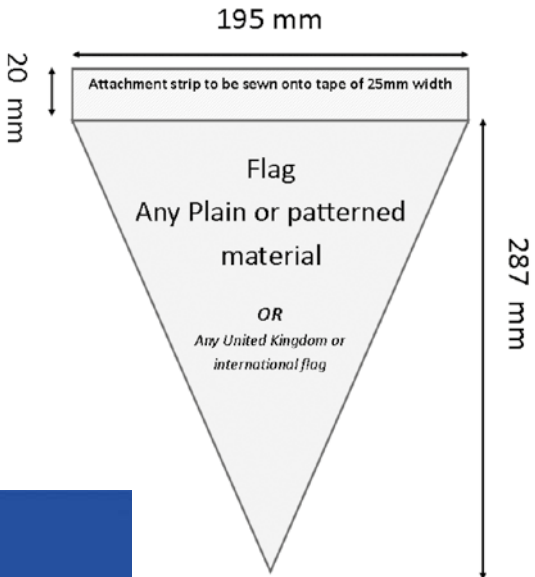
Cranleigh Village VE Day Celebrations

Bunting

Cranleigh Village was going to celebrate the bringing of the lasting peace at the end of World War II by decorating areas of the village in bunting. You may have seen the Facebook posts, but the virus has given us something of a challenge. We can't congregate in the Village Hall to make strips of coloured triangles attached to tape now, but we could decorate our homes and gardens instead.

How about we all make lots and lot of bunting, or just use some you already have, and drape it over your front walls, around your gardens and out of your windows. We will provide bunting making videos for the Parish Council Website and Facebook. The design (to the right) is a template for size. The flags can be made from any old material you have hanging around, for example, old curtains, clothes or bedding and attached to a strip of bunting tape. It would be marvellous to have the village all a flutter on the morning of VE Day on May 8th.
