1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

The Council AGREED the prior commitment apologies of Cllrs A Morrison, H Nicholson, D Nicholas, N Sanctuary, E Townsend, M West and G Worthington, and apology from Cllr R Tyler who is unwell.

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Cllr C Walker declared that he is a member of the Newlands Residents Association.

3. PUBLIC SESSION

There were no members of the public present.

4. WBC STREET TRADING APPLICATION

The Council had NO OBJECTION to the application by West Sussex Whippy, providing they ensure all litter is cleaned up before leaving the area.

5. SCC PROHIBITION OF HEAVY GOODS VEHICLES IN WAVERLEY AND GUILDFORDD CONSULTATION

Cllr E Townsend had sent a report to explain that she has emailed officers to ask again for this HGV prohibition to be extended to the Cranleigh and Ewhurst areas. Prior to becoming a County Councillor, as a Waverley Councillor Representative on the Local Committee, she raised the issue of dangerous and damaging HGV traffic across the Surrey Hills. She has had meetings with Highways Officers since to discuss this and as mentioned has submitted a request again to consider a ban (this does include exceptions including for deliveries).

The Council AGREED to support the areas proposed in the consultation and request that the prohibition order is extended to the curtilage of Cranleigh as there will be a significant migration of heavy goods vehicles to Cranleigh and Ewhurst, where the roads are not capable of supporting the increase in traffic.

The Council raised that the proposal would contravene the proposed Surrey County Council Cranleigh High Street Development aims to create a reduction of traffic and increase the safety for pedestrians. The Council request that the prohibition order is extended to the following roads:

- Knowle Lane
- High Street, Cranleigh
- Elmbridge Road
- Amlets Lane
- Horsham Road
- Guildford Road
- Ewhurst Road
- Bookhurst Road
- The Green, Ewhurst
- Cranleigh Road, Ewhurst
- Shere Road, Ewhurst
